Hello WV AAP Members,

Welcome! I am honored to begin my two-year term as president of the West Virginia Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics. I was thankful that we were all able to get together again in person at the 2024 Children's Healthcare Summit at Canaan Valley Resort in May. I enjoyed learning with each of you and spending time together as friends and colleagues. The Chapter has an exciting year planned! To be effective as a chapter, we need focus, funding, and involvement. We will continue to keep our focus on advocacy for WV childhood immunization as our top priority. As for funding, the chapter was awarded a Benedum Grant for literacy that started on July 1. LITERACY GRANT NEWS:

INVITATION TO JOIN WV AAP LITERACY TASK FORCE



This spring WV AAP received a second grant from the **Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation** for one year to educate and engage pediatric providers in literacy initiatives for WV children and families. We are thrilled about this opportunity and want you to join this important work! We are going to engage our membership in a statewide awareness campaign about the importance of early childhood literacy. The focus of our 2025 Children's Healthcare Summit will be on childhood literacy. WV AAP will also recruit new chapter champions and partner them with existing literacy collaboratives. Early Literacy is a key marker for lifelong success in children. Currently, WV has a 79.1% literacy rate and ranks 34th in the nation with 48% of WV 4th graders reading below a basic reading level. This is a 22% point decline since 2019, highlighting the vital and urgent need of intervention. The WV AAP will be a powerful partner in raising awareness of statewide literacy efforts and bridging communication with pediatric providers. Our overall goal will be to highlight the importance of early childhood literacy and get books in the hands of West Virginia's children. Our goal is to recruit five practices in the state to participate with the Dolly Parton Imagination Library.

The future success of West Virginia and its children vitally depends on reversing the alarming trends in falling literacy rates. One of our objectives will be to partner with the Dolly Parton Imagination Library. It has been very effective nationwide in tackling this very issue by placing books in the hands of children. The WVAAP's partnership with the WV DPIL will ensure this proven program provides this same benefit for all West Virginia children.
